DONALD FRASHER, 89, of Dayton, OH, passed away, Sunday, January 26, 2014. Funeral services will be 2 PM Friday, January 31, 2014, at Schneider-Griffin Funeral Home with Bro. John Frasher officiating. Burial will be in Highland Memorial Gardens, South Point, OH. Donald was born November 8, 1924, in Wayne County, WV, a son of the late Garland and Leaffy Morrison Frasher. In the 196263 season Don rolled a 799 three game series which broke the Dayton city record set in 1935. Don broke a record that stood for 27 years. Don's record was broken later that year. One of the many times when I was having trouble with my game I asked Don if he would watch me and maybe pick up what I was doing wrong. After a few frames he came over and told me he saw the problem.
