Ruth White Daniel, 94, of Chesapeake, Ohio, passed away July 11, 2019, in the Emogene Dolen Jones Hospice House in Huntington, WV. She was born April 2, 1925, the youngest child of Edward Michael and Lula Hollandsworth White in Lincoln County, West Virginia. She was active in the Lawrence County Chapter of Eastern Star, where she fulfilled the responsibilities of various offices while an active member. She was a faithful member of Johnson Memorial United Methodist Church in Huntington. Ruth enjoyed cooking, baking, antiques, swimming, and traveling. Her favorite pastime was spending time with her family. She was an avid reader and lifelong learner. She was a gracious, generous, compassionate woman of many talents, always willing to help others. She gave tirelessly and selflessly of her time, energy, and talent. She exemplified Christ through her character, work ethic, words of wisdom and encouragement, and a genuine love for others. This was evidenced by her many, almost daily, drop-in visits from her large circle of friends. She will be remembered for her kind heart, inner beauty, gentle disposition, sense of humor and quick wit. One of her most satisfying accomplishments was publishing a book, "Unstrung Pearls," compiled of artwork and poetry created by her mother-in-law, Pearl Daniel.
