Warren Lloyd Dumke passed away on Thursday, November 4, 2021. Warren was born on October 26, 1928, in Milwaukee WI, to Harriet and Lorenz Dumke. He was raised by his mother and grandmother, Elisabeth and the grandfather Frederic Diepenhorst, whom he idolized. He received a BS from the University of Wisconsin, a MS from Iowa State University, and a PhD from the University of Nebraska. He served as a professor of physics at Marshall University for 30 years, previously he had taught at Kent State and Mankato State Universities. He loved music, regularly attending the Charleston Chamber Society, Jazz Alley, Ohio Light Opera and Ironton Council for the Arts series and many other events throughout the years. Astronomy, current events, philosophy and good craftsmanship were also a few of his interests. He was a member of the Engineers Club of Huntington, former president; Appalachian Section of the American Physics teachers (former president); Ohio Section of the American Physics Society, American Crystallographic Association, and other organizations. He is survived by his wife of 58 years, Judith Doty Dumke. A Lifelong Lutheran, he was currently a member of St. Paul Lutheran Church, Huntington, WV. Services will be held Saturday, November 13th at St. Paul Lutheran Church, 721 12th Ave. at 1:30 PM, masks are required. Visitation will be one half hour prior to the service.
